Consultation on the applicability of integrated pollution prevention and control to onshore oil exploration activities

- 1. I am writing to invite views on the applicability of integrated pollution prevention and control to onshore oil exploration activities.

- 3. This consultation concerns the proposed amendment of the interpretation and application of Part A(1) of Section 1.2 of Part 2 of EPR Schedule 1. The proposal seeks to clarify that paragraph 4 of Part A(1)(h), the loading, unloading, handling or storage of, or physical, chemical or thermal treatment of crude oil, Stabilised crude petroleum, does not apply to activities for which a petroleum exploration and development licence has been issued by the Minister pursuant to the Petroleum Act 1998.
