Bovine Tuberculosis consultation on the next phase of badger control policy

We are writing to invite views on proposals for the next phase of badger TB control policy. These proposals are part of the Government's bovine TB eradication strategy.

While the majority of our disease control measures focus on cattle, this consultation proposes retaining badger culling as an option in targeted parts of the High-Risk and Edge Area, where there are high levels of infection in cattle, and evidence suggests badgers are part of the problem in the spread of disease to these herds.

The proposal sets out more detail to the provision made in 2021 to retain culling as an option where epidemiological assessment indicates that it is needed.

Culling would continue in these targeted areas until the disease situation has been deemed to have improved, following an annual review by the UK's Chief Veterinary Officer. At this point, badger vaccination would be used to ensure the results achieved through culling are maintained. This sets out a clear exit strategy to non-lethal control, preventing the return of disease in these areas.

The proposal builds on our investment in wider scale badger vaccination, which is now much more of a reality, with more farms involved in vaccination programmes than ever before.

The consultation also seeks views on proposals to reduce the administrative burden placed on farming groups delivering badger culling and vaccination, as well as suggested updates to the ibTB interactive mapping tool which would help those purchasing cattle to better manage risks when sourcing new stock.
