Consultation on proposals to implement the pelagic landing obligation in England.

I am writing to seek your views on our proposals to implement the pelagic landing obligation in England. The landing obligation is a ban on the wasteful practice of fish discarding so that all relevant catches must be brought ashore and not returned to the sea. It is an EU obligation, under the reformed Common Fisheries Policy (CFP) basic regulation. Our proposals have been designed meet our EU obligations while helping the English pelagic fishing industry operate under a landing obligation.

Full details of the proposals are included in the consultation document, which along with a draft Impact Assessment can be found on Defra's consultation website: www.gov.uk/defra.

This consultation is one in a package of consultations linked to the reformed CFP which includes reforms to the CFP basic regulation, the Common Market Organisation of Fishery and Aquaculture Products (CMO) and the European Maritime and Fisheries Fund (EMFF). The purpose of the package of reforms is to deliver sustainable fish stocks, a healthy marine environment and a prosperous fishing industry.

This is a six week consultation to ensure that the responses can be used to develop regional Discard Plans for pelagic fisheries. These pelagic Discard Plans must be submitted to the EU Commission for adoption by 1 June 2014.
