Consultation on Amending The Bread and Flour Regulations 1998 and The Bread and Flour Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1998

- 1. I am writing to invite views on proposals to change The Bread and Flour Regulations 1998 and The Bread and Flour (Northern Ireland) Regulations 1998.
- 2. Defra committed to reviewing the Bread and Flour Regulations 1998 which cover specific compositional and labelling requirements for these products, following the UK's departure from the European Union. Defra, alongside the Department of Health and Social Care (DHSC), Food Standards Agency (FSA) in Northern Ireland and Wales, Food Standards Scotland and the Scottish and Welsh Governments and Department of Health Northern Ireland have been jointly conducting the review. As part of the review, we are now holding a public consultation on proposals which set out to ensure the regulations lead to improved public health, support UK industry, assist enforcement authorities and protect consumers. These include:
- Updating technical standards regarding the minimum level and compositional criteria of added nutrients to non-wholemeal wheat flour, ensuring consistency with other food standards legislation.
- The implementation of government policy to fortify non-wholemeal wheat flour with folic acid to help reduce neural tube defect affected pregnancies.
- Providing further clarity and understanding of the scope of requirements by updating the regulations in line with developments within the industry.
- Exploring opportunities for additional exemptions to reduce burden on industry while not compromising health objectives.
- Introducing improvement notices as an enforcement mechanism for addressing non-compliance with the regulations.
