Consultation on Charging arrangements at government-run Border Control Posts

In the recently published draft <u>Target Operating Model</u>, government outlined its plan to charge for eligible sanitary and phytosanitary (SPS) consignments. The charge would recover operating costs for government-run border control posts (BCPs). As part of this plan, it committed to consulting on the proposed methodology and rates.

I am writing to invite views on Defra's intention to administer a single Common User Charge for eligible SPS consignments at government-run BCPs serving the Port of Dover and Eurotunnel Le Shuttle in England. We would like your views on the principles, methodology and indicative rates of the Common User Charge to determine fair and reasonable charges. We also want to get your feedback, in the form of evidenced examples, which show any potential impact and implications that these charges would have upon your trading.
