ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT ASSESSMENT – JOINT TECHNICAL CONSULTATION (planning changes to regulations on Forestry, Agriculture, Water Resources, Land Drainage and Marine Works)

- 1. I am writing to invite views on the <u>consultation</u> on the transposition of the changes made by EU Directive 2014/52/EU to the Environmental Impact Assessment Directive 2011/92/EU through national implementing regulations and other changes to some of these regulations.
- 2. This consultation relates to six regulations, as amended:
 - a) The Environmental Impact Assessment (Forestry) (England and Wales) Regulations 1999, as amended, which apply in England and Wales;
 - b) The Environmental Impact Assessment (Agriculture) (England) (No.2) Regulations 2006, which apply in England only;
- c) <u>The Water Resources (Environmental Impact Assessment) (England and Wales) (Amendment) Regulations 2003, as amended, these apply in England and Wales;</u>
- d) <u>The Environmental Impact Assessment (Land Drainage Improvement Works)</u> Regulations 1999, as amended in 2005 and in 2006, these apply in England and Wales;
- e) The Marine Works (Environmental Impact Assessment) Regulations 2007, as amended in 2009, 2011, and in 2015, these apply across the UK; and
- f) The Environmental Impact Assessment (Fish Farming in Marine Waters) Regulations 1999, these apply in England and Wales.
- 3. This is a joint consultation between Defra, the Welsh Government, the Scottish Government and the Department of Agriculture, Environment and Rural Affairs in Northern Ireland Department.
- 4. We propose to revoke the regulations covering fish farming in marine waters. The consultation explains that relevant provisions to cover any such development in future would be added to revised regulations on marine works. Separate legislation on Fish Farming in Marine Waters is being taken forward in Northern Ireland.
