Purpose of consultation

We are consulting the public to gather views on the provisions as well as the standards for the private keeping of primates. All evidence gathered will be considered while finalising the policy outcome and the final drafting of the provisions and standards.



This consultation will be open for 4 weeks.

Stakeholders have previously been consulted on this policy through a public consultation launched in 2020. This consultation asked for views on the drafting of the provisions for the primate licensing scheme in the Animal Welfare (Kept Animals) Bill (KAB). Selected stakeholders have also been engaged with the drafting of the standards and all views will influence the finalisation of the standards.

The consultation document clearly outlines what is being proposed in the regulations and how this differs from the previously agreed provisions in the KAB. By contributing to this consultation, respondents have the opportunity to influence the final drafting of the regulations and standards. A summary of responses and official government response will be published following the closure of this consultation and analysis of the results.
