Consultation on implementation of Part IV of the Biodiversity Beyond National Jurisdiction (BBNJ) Agreement on Environmental Impact Assessments.

1. I am writing to invite views on the implementation of Part IV of the Biodiversity Beyond National Jurisdiction (BBNJ) Agreement on Environmental Impact Assessments (EIAs).
2. Defra and the Scottish Government are seeking information on potential activities taking place in the high seas and seeking views on proposed amendments to the marine licensing regimes under the Marine and Coastal Access Act 2009 (MCAA) and the Marine (Scotland) Act 2010 (MSA).
3. This consultation also reviews the division of licensing responsibilities in Areas Beyond National Jurisdiction (ABNJ) between the MCAA and the MSA.
