Report to Parliament about Inshore Fisheries and Conservation Authorities (IFCAs) conduct and operation: a 'Call for Evidence'

The Defra Secretary of State must prepare a report into the conduct and operation of IFCAs every four years from the date when IFCAs were first established in 2010. The report must be laid before Parliament. Defra has started a process to collect evidence that will go towards this first report.

I invite you to respond to our 'Call for Evidence' and help us understand how individual IFCAs have worked to meet their duties and demonstrated the local leadership that might be expected of a statutory regulator.
