## Consultation on changes to marine licensing fees and charges

I am writing to seek your views on proposals to revise the fees structure for marine licensing as operated by the Marine Management Organisation (MMO) on behalf of the Secretary of State.

These proposals seek to recover a higher proportion of the costs the MMO incurs in dealing with marine licensing applications whilst at the same time minimising the impacts on businesses through efficiency measures and, for certain smaller projects, by providing a public subsidy.

The MMO administers marine licensing under Part 4 of the Marine and Coastal Access Act 2009 (MCAA) on behalf of the Secretary of State. The current fees are set out in the Marine Licensing (Applications Fees) Regulations 2011 which are made under Sections 67(3) and 316(b) of the MCAA. Subject to the consultation, it is proposed that the new fees structure will come into force on 6 April 2014.

The consultation applies to English waters and the offshore areas of Wales and Northern Ireland where the Secretary of State is the licensing authority.
