What data's collected and how it's used

Natural England will collect your:

- name
- email address
- your organisation
- your opinions

Your personal data will be used to contact you about the research. Your opinions will be used to assess the impact of the proposed changes to the measurements used in the reporting of SSSI condition in England. A summary report on the findings will be published following the consultation.

The legal basis for processing your data

Natural England will be using the legal basis of consent.

Consent to process your data

The processing of your data is based on consent, you will normally be able to withdraw your consent at any time. However, it will not be possible to withdraw your consent to use the data collected for this project up to 3 weeks after the end of the consultation. After this date the data will be collated anonymously for analysis and reporting and individual data will not be able to be extracted. You can withdraw your data by emailing:

Who Natural England shares your data with

Natural England will not share personal data with third parties.

Natural England respects your personal privacy when responding to access to information requests. Natural England only shares information when necessary to meet the statutory requirements of the Environmental Information Regulations 2004 and the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

How long Natural England holds personal data

Natural England will keep your personal data for 10 years after the end of the project.

What happens if you do not provide the data

Natural England cannot include your opinions into the results of the consultation.

Use of automated decision-making or profiling

The information you provide is not used for:

- automated decision making (making a decision by automated means without any human involvement)
- profiling (automated processing of personal data to evaluate certain things about an individual)

Transfer of data outside the European Economic Area (EEA)

Your data will not be transferred outside of the EEA.

Your rights
