Consultation on the draft Environmental Permitting (England and Wales) Regulations 2015

- Defra and the Welsh Government have published a consultation on proposals to enhance measures to tackle waste crime and entrenched poor performance in the waste sector. Part I of the consultation seeks your comments on strengthening the regulators' powers in respect of **all types of facilities** that operate under an environmental permit. The proposed enhancements broaden the scope of the regulators' powers to prevent or remedy pollution.

Part II of this document is a call for evidence on other measures to tackle waste crime and entrenched poor performance in the waste management industry and seeks your views on measures to strengthen the demonstration of competence to operate a site; require the clean-up of abandoned and orphaned waste management sites; adopt fixed penalties for fly-tipping; and measures to protect landowners/ landlords from the impacts of waste crime.
