Consultation on rules for mobile crushing of lamps that contain mercury

- 1. Defra and the Welsh Government have published a consultation on the rules for mobile crushing of lamps that contain mercury.
- 2. Currently the T17 waste exemption provides for the treatment of lamps by crushing for the purpose of volume reduction.
- 3. The purpose of this consultation is to seek your views and comments on options for the regulation of mobile lamp crushing, including replacing the T17 exemption with the requirement for an environmental permit.
- 4. This is to ensure that the regulatory requirements and levels of compliance checking for mobile lamp crushing are sufficient for human health and environmental protection, provide a level playing field for businesses involved in lamp recycling and are in line with and provide legal clarity on minimum European requirements.
